In May, our Spanish children and teachers came to Manchester to visit us and what a week we had! We welcomed our Spanish friends into school with our special Manchester welcome on the playground, followed by our welcome assemblies where our younger children showed off their Spanish singing. Our children got up to so many wonderful things including art lessons, sports, our singing square, reading to our younger children, a trip to Martin Mere and more! A highlight of the week was all of our children, Spanish and English, singing Oasis 'Don't Look Back in Anger.'

Nursery





This Half-Term...

This half-term, our topic has been Food and Growth. We enjoyed reading the story 'Jasper's Beanstalk'. We practised sequencing the story, the days of the week, and drawing and labelling a picture of what might be at the top of the beanstalk. We also looked at 'Oliver's Vegetables'. We had lots of vegetables in our class and we learned lots of words to describe them. We even painted with them! We also practised our letter formation by writing words from the story.

In Maths, we have been learning about shape. We learned about and drew a variety of 2D and 3D shapes. We also went on a shape hunt around the environment looking for shapes we recognised, and made a tally chart to count how many of each shape we found.

We have had lots of exciting visitors this half-term! Two police officers came to tell us all about what they do and how they help people. They even brought in their police car and we got to sit in it! Farmer David came as well, bringing a selection of animals from his farm for us to feed, hold and observe. We had so much fun!

We have enjoyed starting PE too. We have been looking at different ways of travelling and moving, practising moving like animals and different modes of transport.

Our children say...

"The police came and I drived. I want to be a policeman!"

"The farm brought some animals, we got to stroke the animals and we saw eggs. It was exciting!"

"I went on a shape hunt and we finded a triangle, a circle and a rectangle."









Reception





This Half-Term...

This half term our topic had been 'Food & Growth'. In literacy we have focused on the key texts 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and 'Supertato'. We have been working hard to retell stories, ensuring there is a beginning, middle and end. We even discovered Evil pea had tied up Supertato in our small world area.

In Mathematics, we have been focusing on doubles, odd and even numbers and number bonds. In our outdoor are we had a 'Superhero Number Hunt'. Once we found our superheroes, we tried to subitise an arrangement of dots and we discussed how each number was arranged and the different compositions of each number e.g. '6 is made from 5 and one more'.

We had a lovely day with the Bowland Farm animals. First we stroked some ducks and chickens. We enjoyed learning all about how Farmer David looks after all of the animals before feeding and walking them.

Two police officers came in their police car to visit us on the Early Years playground. The traffic officers told us all about what they do to keep everybody safe. They spoke about their uniforms and how the sirens work on their cars. The children had lots of questions for them and were on their best behaviour.

"Supertato is my favourite. He can fly and defeat Evil Pea."

"The Police came from the station to our school. They showed us the lights and the siren in their car."

"I love the alpaca the most. I took one for a walk with Farmer David".

This Half-Term...

This half-term, both Class 3 and 4 have completed their second worships. Class 3 delivered a worship on the Ascension and Class 4 delivered one on Pentecost. Both classes thoroughly enjoyed preparing and performing their worships.

In Science, we have started our new topic learning about plants. We have learnt the structure of a plant and have planted our own seeds. We can't wait to see how they grow over the next few weeks!

In Design & Technology, we have created our own playgrounds using recyclable materials in the style of Charles Wicksteed. We learnt how to plan, create and evaluate our designs.

In Computing, we have been developing our skills in data collection. We recently learnt how to independently use and make pictograms to gather data.

Our children say...

"I loved planting the seeds and want to be a gardener when I grow up!"

"I liked in Maths learning about fractions and I can help mum cut up a pizza now into equal parts."

"In Topic, we got to do a tour of the school. I loved seeing the big corridor and the older children."













This Half-Term...

As part of our English lessons this half-term we read, 'The Last Wolf.' We focused on endangered animals and deforestation. The children wrote letters to King Charles II and the Prime Minister and discussed changes we could make to save our wonderful planet.

We have been busy learning all about plants this half-term. We have learnt about what plants need in order to survive and we conducted a number of investigations to test various hypothesis. We even planted our own sunflowers and cared for this within class.

This half term we have been learning all about the seven continents and five oceans. We specifically looked at Antarctica and Africa and used our IT skills to create a Pic Collage on iPads with information we had learnt.

In Maths, our new topic is 'Data Handling' so as part of our discovery lesson we used some PE equipment and looked at all the different ways we could sort it and discussed how this could be represented.

Our children say...

"Learning about the different continents has been so interesting. I really loved learning different facts about Africa!"

"I loved sharing my geography project with the class and I enjoyed researching facts about Vietnam." "I really enjoyed making my Pentecost party hat and I can't wait for our party-it will be SO much fun."









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This Half-Term...

This half term, we have been using the book 'Journey' in English to help us write descriptively. Journey is a wordless book, so we have had to use our detective skills to infer lots of the information. It has helped us to create effective setting descriptions.

In Religion, we have been learning about Pentecost and the Power of the Holy Spirit. We have learnt about the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit and how we can put these into action in our daily lives.

In Design and Technology, we have looked at levers and linkages. We have had lot of fun designing and making a card for a younger child.

In Maths, we have just started to learn Roman numerals to 12 and how to tell the time. Telling the time is a challenging skill and we are working hard to master this!

Our children say...

"I like DT a lot. I really liked pulling the lever and seeing the movement on my card."

"I have enjoyed looking at our English book the Journey and finding out about the girl's great adventure."

"I am enjoying finding out what numbers are in Roman Numerals and I am getting better at telling the time."













This Half-Term...

This term, Class 9 completed their second worship all about St Catherine of Siena. We spent time as a class learning about her inspiring life and thinking about how we could use our own skills and talents to spread God's word and be who God wants us to be.

In Topic, we have been learning about rivers and how pollution can impact our environment. We were lucky enough to be able to canoe down the River Mersey, complete a river investigation and go on a woodland walk on our day at Venture Out. We had so much fun!

In English, we have been researching about sloths and learning more about the features of a non – chronological report. We blew our teachers away with all of our amazing facts and beautifully written reports! We are now Sloth experts – really, ask us anything!

Our children say...

"I loved learning about sloths and watching David Attenborough documentaries all about them!"

·"I liked learning about fractions and improving at the trickier parts."

"The river trip was the best, especially the canoeing!"













This Half-Term...

This half-term, we have engaged in our Spanish exchange programme! At the beginning of the half term, some of us had the opportunity to visit Nigran in Spain where we enjoyed many cultural activities with our Spanish pen pals. For those of us that stayed in Didsbury, we enjoyed many enrichment opportunities including canoeing, orienteering and even a visit to the cinema! Towards the end of term, our Spanish friends visited us in Didsbury and again we had a fantastic time! We have put all our Spanish speaking into practice and can't believe the experience we have had! In English, we have used the inspiration person 'Greta Thunberg' to inspire our persuasive and emotive writing all about climate change. We have written persuasive letters to political leaders as well as writing and performing emotive speeches. In Topic, we have begun to learn about São Paulo in our topic: Destination São Paulo: What do places have in common? We have learnt that São Paulo is the biggest city in the Southern Hemisphere and is known as a 'mega city'.

We have had the opportunity to participate in Gaelic Football sessions this half-term. Every Wednesday, we have joined in lessons where we have learnt new skills which have helped us to play games of Gaelic Football.

"I have enjoyed writing a persuasive letter – I wrote to Rishi Sunak to tell him all about climate change and what we need to do to help."
"In Science, we have been learning about Earth and Space, we have learnt about the solar system – did

"I loved the Spanish exchange. When we were in Nigran we went kayaking, we went to the beach a lot and we had so much fun!"














This Half-Term...

Year 6 children have worked tirelessly this half-term to prepare for their SATs tests. We have tried lots of different ways to make revision fun this half-term including musical SPAG! We celebrated with an indoor picnic due to the weather not being suitable for the park. Well done to all of our children; we are so proud of all of you and we are looking forward to all of the great things still to come this term!

In Topic, we have learnt lots of interesting facts about Islamic Civilisation. We understand how Islam was formed and how Baghdad became a major hub of trade and knowledge which contributes to the world we live in today.

Our Art lessons have been focused around Nadia Janjua. She is a visual artist who is famous for her Islamic artwork, which focuses on geometric patterns and colour. A link with our History topic.

During our PE lessons with Mr Hollins, we have been working on our basketball and netball skills whilst competing in lots of mini-competitions against each other.

Music



Year 6 children have really enjoyed some time to work collaboratively to explore technology to create inspiring raps around themes such as antibullying and online safety,

Year 5 spent time listening to and appreciating lullabies from across the globe, learning about $^{3}/_{4}$ time as well as singing and learning to play an accompaniment to the beautiful lullaby 'Ballo Baleerie' from The Shetland Islands.

Our Year 4 children have been responding enthusiastically to the music of Spain including the rhythmic 'Habanera'. This was a great tool for them all to count, keep the pulse and dance, as well as play on tuned/untuned percussion instruments and they had the chance to compose together and individually, too.

In Year 3, they have had the opportunity to be 'reflective' in our topic about 'Sound Symmetry,' and to develop musical learning based on their understanding in Maths. They explored the structure in some familiar songs and nursery rhymes and composed symmetrical tunes.





Music



Our fabulous and tuneful Year 2's have explored a litany of little creatures in their unit on 'Minibeasts', furthering their understanding of timbre and rhythm, using classroom percussion instruments and movement to represent the crawling, scurrying creatures in the song. Our Music lessons in Year 1 have been 'jam-packed' with energy and fun as they all enjoyed the unit 'Menu Song!' The unit is based around a fun, cumulative song with 'off beat' rhythms that present a series of tasty dishes over the course of the week. Children have continued to practise their skills in listening, keeping the beat and developing a sense of pitch by echo singing the leader and produced a very theatrical performance with percussion instruments and some great singing! Some children said it was their favourite song yet!







Music



Our fabulous Reception children respond brilliantly in their Music lessons each week. Our topic, 'Down there under the Sea' paints a musical picture of marine life and this song and unit of learning have been great for exploring a sea-themed soundscape, composing new lyrics and creating a sea accompaniment using props e.g. sea shells, sea creatures and pirate hats to enhance the singing and movement. The children loved learning some notation including notes (C,D,E) on glockenspiels and enthusiastically joined in with keeping the beat with percussion instruments to accompany the song. I always receive a cheery and smiley welcome when I enter the Nursery for Music but it maybe because they relish the opportunity to be clutching cuddly toys as part of their learning experience! The unit of learning called 'Animal Tea Party' featured a range of animals who all make a sound that fits with the music including a crocodile, lion, duck and snake but we customised the song and added our own animals, too. The children have been learning to respond to the song with words and movement, by moving their soft toys to the music. It was GREAT fun and smiles all round!



Sports



It has been another jam packed half-term for sports!

Key Stage 2 children thoroughly enjoyed an assembly with a famous netball player from Manchester Thunder Team: Shadine Van Der Merwe.

The Year 6 Boys' Football Team competed against another school in a knock out tournament. It was a tense match with extra time but unfortunately, we were beaten on penalties.
