We have been investigating symmetry too and used pipettes to put paint on one side of a butterfly, folded the paper and pressed down, before revealing our beautiful, symmetrical butterflies!

We have enjoyed lots of other wonderful events, such as Sports Day, Blue Day, Singing Square and our first ever class Worship. And how could we forget our end of year beach party! We have had so much fun!

Our children say...

This Half-Term...

Class 5 celebrated their final worship this half-term. Our worship was all about our time in Year 2. We talked about what we had learnt and our proudest achievements this year. As part of our Science topic about animals, we went on a trip to Knowsley Safari Park. Here we went on a safari drive with one of the park rangers and learnt all about the animals. We also watched a birds of prey display and a sealion show. It was so much fun and it really helped to bring our topic to life.

In Class 6, we also celebrated our final class worship in Year 2. We talked all about God's world, giving facts about continents and oceans which we had learnt in Geography. We even took the audience on a coach tour through Kenya and learnt to sing a song using Makaton!

Our Design Technology topic this half-term was all about moving mechanisms. We worked in small groups to design and make our own car. We used Hot Wheels car designs as our inspiration. Our cars looked amazing and we are awaiting a call from Formula One!

Our children say...

"I loved our school trip to the safari park and my favourite part was watching the sealion show."

"I loved making a car in DT and I think I could get a job working for Tesla!"

"We used ScratchJr to make our own moving animations and to recreate our trip to the zoo. It was so much fun!"













This Half-Term...

In PE, we have had a dance teacher in school to teach us some street dance moves! We have been lucky to put the different moves together into a dance sequence. It has been lots of fun keeping in time with the music.

Our DT Project for this term has been themed around textiles. We have enjoyed sewing a purse/wallet and have been very creative with our designs. Sewing has been a mindful and fun activity!

In Maths, we have been looking at shape and even had a go at making our own 3D shapes using spaghetti and marshmallows. It was challenging, but we persevered!

In Topic, we have been learning all about our local environment of Didsbury. We have been finding out about all the human and physical characteristics and even managed a trip to Didsbury Village, the River Mersey and Didsbury Park.

Our children say...

"I have enjoyed sewing the materials using the blanket stitch. It was tricky sometimes when the thread was knotting but I persevered!"

"I have loved learning new dance moves and skills and getting better the more I practise."

"I have found it interesting learning about why people choose Didsbury to live in and why they like being here because there are lots of parks and places to stay."













This Half-Term...

This half-term, Year 4 children have learnt more about the general election and a number of political parties in lead up to the election. We had a fantastic opportunity to take part in a mock election at Barlow, which we loved! In Topic, we have been learning about our wonderful city of Manchester. We have explored Manchester during the Industrial Revolution and discussed significant figures in Manchester such as Emmeline Pankhurst, Marcus Rashford and Oasis. In English, we have been learning about the formation of caves and their features, particularly Blue John Cavern. We have been reading 'Blue John', a story of a young boy, Blue John, who was made from the blue of the glacier and the hot yellow light of the sun.

In Science, we have been learning about teeth – how they are formed, what they are called and their different roles. We also completed an experiment to discover which drinks causes the most decay of our teeth and we were shocked to find that orange juice caused more decay than coke!

Our children say...

"I have enjoyed cricket because it has been really fun working as a team, especially in our new classes."

"I liked reading the Blue John book as a class and learning about Blue John Cavern."

"I liked the teeth investigation and seeing how our enamel can decay on our teeth like the egg's shell."















This Half-Term...

This half-term, Year 5 pupils have had the opportunity to visit the Barlow High School to participate in computing lessons. The lessons have enabled pupils to design and create a web page all about one of our topics – Sao Paulo. The children have thoroughly enjoyed this opportunity and made some fantastic websites jam packed with information all about visiting Sao Paulo.

In reading and writing this half-term, we have been studying the text 'Journey to the River Sea' by Eva Ibbotson. Set in the Amazon, the main character Maia travels to live with distant relatives and embarks on a great adventure. We have used to text to help us write setting descriptions and persuasive, informal letters.

In Religion, our topic of 'Freedom and Responsibility' has made us think about how we often need rules even when we are given freedom. We have been thinking about the Ten Commandments and The Beatitudes and how we are blessed by God.

In Maths, we have explored converting measure with practical lessons involving measuring ingredients and comparing scale. This then helped us to enjoy pancakes and Angel Delight! The children have worked incredibly hard in maths this half-term – we hope this continues over the summer with the TT Rockstars tournament that has been set up by Mrs Connelly!

Our children say...

"We have really enjoyed this term's PE, where we have been taught cricket and gymnastics by specialists in these sports."

"We have learned a lot of new things in Science, including that plants can reproduce in different ways and that some mammals do lay eggs!"

"I think everybody enjoyed going to Barlow to do our lessons on webpage design."















This Half-Term...

This-half term, the children have worked incredibly hard on our Year 6 production: 'I'm an 11 year old...get me out of here!' From learning lines and choreographing songs to making props and designing art work, the children put on fantastic performances.

We have had lots of opportunities to be creative by completing our Islamic Art work inspired by Nadia Janjua.

The children learnt some crucial life skills on our school trip to 'Crucial Crew' where we were involved in sessions led by: Greater Manchester Police, First Aid, Co2 Crew, Transport for Greater Manchester and North West Electricity.

The children had an amazing time at their leavers party. They definitely 'dressed to impress' and danced away to the sounds of DJ Daly and DJ Jones!

Our children say...

"Crucial Crew was really fun! We learned about keeping safe in different situations and it made me think about what sort of job I'd like to do when I'm older."

"I've really enjoyed Art, especially the relief printing where we used Styrofoam and poster paint to create our own stamps."

"I can't wait to perform the play! It's really funny and we've worked hard on the singing and dancing."

The governors continue to monitor progress against the Five Year Plan which was developed alongside staff, parents and children in May 2023. Some of the progress made against the Plan this year has included:

Shape the whole person

- Significant improvements have been made to sports provision for the children, including a wider programme of extracurricular activities.
- The music provision within school has gone from strength to strength, including more opportunities for the children to showcase their musical learning and talents.
- The Spanish exchange continues to be a key part of our school life, and school is currently re-applying for the International Schools Award.

Strive for excellence

- Research-led changes to methods of teaching and learning have been introduced as we look to ensure the highest quality of education for the children in our school.
- The school's provision for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) has continued to be a key area of focus to ensure that all children receive the support they need to excel.
- Resources continue to be invested into improving the quality of writing, an area particularly impacted by COVID, and this will continue to be a key focus going forwards.

- Work is ongoing to ensure that the best possible use is made of our school site, with the aim of a new school kitchen still a key priority.
